FIFTH MISSOURI INFANTRY, COMPANY A (CSA) MINUTES OF MEETING HELD August 28, 1990

The monthly meeting was called to order at the Old Courthouse Museum by President Charlie Riggs at 6:50 PM. Those attending included 7 veterans, 3 recruits & 3 noncombatants. Guests present were Kent & Karmann Nelson of Crowley's Infantry and Keith Daleen of the SCV.

Karmann Nelson briefed us on what transpired at Crowley's meeting two weeks ago. It appears that Crowley's will strongly support all remaining 1990 events.

Recruits Don Roberts and Steve Yoakum, having met the requirements of the By-laws and recommended by their sponsors, were accepted as Veterans.

The minutes & treasurer's reports were accepted. Our bank balance is \$115.92.

Bill reported on the MCWRA board meeting. They discussed (to us) the status of probationary units. Our performance is viewed as satisfactory with the exception of what was deemed intemperate criticism of the organizer of the Macon event by one of our members. A key point brought up by the MCWRA president is that a little diplomacy in dealing with problems never hurts. Other units on probation were criticized for their field performance. Other items discussed without resolution included scheduling criteria, insurance, safety, & MCWRA history.

Windsor event update: Since Mark Moser of the Windsor Chamber of Commerce could not attend, Bill & George visited him on Monday. They reviewed the new location for the event, which is not as attractive as the Cooper place, but still is an excellent location. Mark had reported 2 meals covered; Ronnie reported another breakfast covered since Monday, & Charlie & Todd volunteered hams for Sunday lunch. The Air Force cannot provide water buffs or tents; the Chamber is making other arrangements for water & we'll work on the tent. All other aspects seem to be on schedule.

The Event Schedule was discussed. Information is contained on the Event Details sheet handed out with the agenda.

Other appearances were discussed. Ronnie Lee wants tents set up about 8:00 on September 1st at the Windsor Crafts show near the arena east of town. MINDSOR SCENARIO & GUIDELINES

This event portrays a typical Confederate recruiting camp in Missouri in 1862. Such camps were set up by State & Confederate officers with a few enlisted personnel. The majority of the recruits would be civilians. However, after a year of bushwhacking and guerrilla activity, many civilians would have been able to pick up some military gear. In addition, a few regulars home on leave or discharged for age might be in attendance. Such a camp was set up by Col Vard Cockrell a few miles west of Windsor in the summer of 1862; those recruits comprised the main Confederate force at the Battle of Lone Jack. In addition, querrilla cavalry units were plentiful.

By this point in 1862, there were several types of Federal units in western Missouri. Regular infantry and cavalry units from other states were present, as well as the Missouri State Militia and the Enrolled Militia (described as a sort of Home Guard). Most would be uniformed, but some pro-Union civilians and bushwhackers might also take part.

SCENARIO: The Federals discover a Confederate recruiting camp & attempt to break it up & capture the leaders. The recruits have been drilling a week or more, & should be competent in basic company manuevers; if captured, they expect they'll be court-martialled & executed.

SPECIFIC UNIFORM GUIDELINES:

Confederate Infantry: There should be very few shell jackets, with most dressed in civilian clothes. Any period percussion weapons are OK, with shotguns, revolvers, and sporting rifles preferred over liberated Enfields. Captured Federal gear of all types is OK.

Federal Infantry: Sack coats and sky blue pants preferred. Units portraying home guards may be in partial civilian attire and should have older weapons.

Confederate Cavalry: Straight guerrilla impression. Lots of revolvers and shotguns preferred.

Federal cavalry: Regular cav impression. Local MSM units are documented serving with sabers & carbines in 1862.

Artillery: Mountain howitzers preferred. Full scale desired.

ALL CLOTHING MUST BE OF APPROPRIATE MATERIALS AND STYLES.

Those who do their shopping at Aunt Polly Ester's need not attend. Eyeglasses must be in period frames.

FLAGS: Any flag may be displayed on company streets; however, event management will specify which flags may be carried in battle.

EVENT DETAILS

ST CHARLES, MO, Sep 22-23. NEW INFO: Saturday scenario will be Camp Jackson affair, so ladies will have opportunity to get shot down by Lyon's Dutch militia. Sunday expect rebs will attack in waves because of limited space. Understand they have a shortage of Feds, so this might be a good chance to bring your blue coat & commit atrocities. We preregistered about 10-12. It will be generic Reb, lots of nice amenities including fancy dinner & a river boat ball. The field is a riverfront park right adjacent to the old historic downtown area, with lots of antique stores, the 1st State Capitol, touristy sites. Those who've attended really like it. To get there, I-70 to St Charles, use either exit 228 or 229. This is a major metropolitan area.

ST JOSEPH, MD, Sep 29-30. UPDATE: Sponsors request 100% authenticity: secure anachronisms outside public eye or don't bring any (coolers are an anachronism). Infantry requires 3-band muskets, no knives or revolvers; otherwise impression is generic reb. No resurrection on Saturday. Overall Reb commander is Kevin Wells, who has limited command experience; infantry is John Beck of 9th TX. Registration Friday noon to midnight, tactical 9-11 AM Saturday, Sat battle 5:15 PM, Sun battle 1:30 PM. They furnish rations, straw, hay, wood, sanitary (no powder). Nice location, close to town near Mo Western football stadium. We preregistered about 10-12. To get there, take I-29 north out of KC, east on US 36 to Riverside Dr, north to Mitchell Ave, west to MWSC (or follow Missouri Western signs).

BELLEVILLE, IL, Oct 6-7. I preregistered 8. They're redoing the battle of Belmont far from its original location. This is a St Louis suburb, near Scott AFB, & claim \$50,000 budget for event. 200 acre site, meals, medals, powder, straw, wood, 50,000 spectators expected. Confederate infantry commander will be Layne Chartrand of the drilling 11th Miss; understand may be some problem with Feds as it conflicts with Perryville. Impression is early war, reasonably well equipped, fully authentic, 2 or 3 band muskets. Side events include Ladies' tea, formal ball. Freeburg is 6 mi east of Belleville. To get there, I-70 thru St Louis to I-64, I-64 e to IL 159, IL 159 south to IL 15, IL 15 e to Jefferson Rd. Look for signs.

PRAIRIE GROVE, ARK, Dec 1-2. Take US 71 south past Fayetteville, AR, then US 62 west to Prairie Grove. This is original battlefield, where Blunt & Herron faced Hindman & Shelby in Dec 1862. Confederates held the field, but retired southward after dark. Event includes 2 skirkishes Saturday, battle on Sunday, around restored buildings. Impression is Trans-miss, fairly well equipped, bring your overcoat. We have to preregister individual names on their form by Nov 1. Amenities include BREAKFAST rations, all normal (no powder). Town is supportive, with decent cafe's.

- * September 22-23: St Charles. Nice battle on riverfront. Two battles, parade, fashion show, dinner/ball, powder issue. See June CAMPAIGNER & EVENT DETAILS.
- * September 29-30: St Joseph. Battle ω / tactical. Pre-reg info doesn't discuss impression, etc.
- * October 6-7: Belleville, IL. Reenactment of Battle of Belmont (November 1861). Battles both days. See EVENT DETAILS.
- ◆ DCTOBER 20-21: WINDSOR. 5th MO MAX, 1862 MO impression. This is OUR event.
- * December 1-2, Prairie Grove, AR. Traditionally a good event, several actions. See EVENT DETAILS.
