MINUTES OF MEETING HELD September 24, 1991

The meeting was called to order by the President at 7:15 PM at the Johnson County Historical Society, Warrensburg. In attendance were veterans Riggs, Koffman, Wayne, Conner, D. Roberts, Sherrer, Ballman. & Bears: Recruits Tucker, Kerksiek, Zimmerschied & Lee: non-combatants Horton, Cindy Lee. Deb Bears Judy Riggs & Sandra Wayne: associate Kesinger. Guest was Donnie Brant, who was contacted at Fall Festival & fell in with us at Lexington.

Jeff Tucker, having met all criteria for Veteran status was accepted as a Veteran.

The minutes as published in the last Messenger were accepted with the attendance list corrected to read Durrill instead of Faught. The Treasurer reported a bank balance of \$759.47. with \$70 pledged to the Cockrell Flag restoration & \$40 owed to MCWRA.

No significant correspondence was received. It was requested we send a thank you letter to Steve Lillard & Janae Fuller on the quality of the Lexington event. Kathryn Horton will prepare a draft letter & the Secretary will prepare it for mailing.

Equipment acquisition proposals were entertained. It was moved & seconded that we buy another wall tent since the Ladies are suffering from insufficient tentage. Dave Kesinger offered to sell us his wall tent & A tent for \$250. John Sherrer moved/D. Roberts second, approved.

Fund raising status was discussed: George provided details of the bratwurst sale this weekend. A \$256 check to Coca-Cola & a \$75 seed money check were approved. The bratwurst will be purchased on an account established for the purpose at Price Chopper. Pricing at \$1 per wurst/.50 per soda allows a 100% markup. George has work schedules prepared.

John Sherrer presented a design for a company T-shirt. Cost to us will be \$5 for one color/\$8 for 4 color if we buy 30, about \$1 less if we buy 50. Some discussion ensued as to whether this shirt would be sold to the public without the 5th Mo letters, but decision was postponed because of lack of funds. Bob K. moved/Don second that we buy 50 with an oval format & 5th Missouri Infantry, Company A. CSA lettering, to be sold to members at \$10 each.

The event schedule was discussed: details are generally covered in the Messenger. Discussion of the annual banquet indicated that due to mistaken communication, Sandra had assumed that Sedalia was not available & initiated a commitment to Warrensburg University Inn. Bob Koffman said that he had only discussed prices in general in Sedalia & had not obtained any commitment on date or other specifics.

Consensus was that Sedalia would be a preferable site for the people from Columbia/Jeff City. Bill indicated that the deadline for the Messenger was fast approaching since he wanted to get the Roscoe information out more than a week in advance - he'd planned to take it to Bizmart to repro on Sep 25th. Todd said he'd call Best Western in Sedalia around 10:00 AM to get details & see if the weekend we want would be available. Based on the estimated costs, a \$10 per plate price looked reasonable.

Bill suggested that anyone who hadn't turned in their MCWRA Board vote needed to do so by the 30th. He also invited anyone who desired to attend the MCWRA Annual Meeting in Jeff City on Nov. 16th.

A method for absentee ballots for the January elections was discussed. There was no support for changing the current method, so the issue dropped for lack of a motion.

It was suggested that a Ladies' Committee be formed to help new ladies obtain clothes, learn about reenacting, etc. Deb Bears volunteered to head this committee. She will draft a non-combatant version of the Recruit Guide & provide it to Bill to put on the computer. Bill also suggested that the CLO was a long-established resource for ladies to affiliate with. In conjunction with this, the Field Commander was asked to determine the source of the order that prevented ladies from entering the camps at mealtime at Wilson Creek, thus denying them the food they'd paid for.

People who borrow company equipment need to return it properly cleaned. Several suggestions, such as field cleaning, restricting subsequent use, renting the equipment, etc. were discussed, without any firm solution being agreed upon.

A Mr Seeley who lives SE of Warrensburg has offered use of his place for live fire. It was agreed that this would be an optional event listed on our schedule when the interested parties had made the arrangements. Safety in ensuring no Minie skirts are left in barrels was emphasized.

The next meeting will be held at the Annual Banquet. The meeting adjourned at 8:50 PM.

Our drill at Lexington was mixed - we didn't do as well as we should have, even with the many new folks, but the impression was authentic. However, when doing safety inspections I noted lots of problems with improperly cleaned guns, so I'm devoting this column to passing on some tricks I've picked up over the past five seasons.

AT HOME: There are two ways to clean the gun - the right way & the quick way. In either case, the first thing to clean is the nipple. Pull the nipple, use the nipple pick to loosen up residue in the nipple & get out as much as you can. The bolster is the area the nipple fits into. Right below the nipple a hard skin with its own flash-hole will develop. It will gradually pack up from beneath if not cleaned out & will block the flash hole completely. Use the nipple pick to break out as much as you can before wetting down the barrel. Now you're ready to get going:

First: get your supplies ready. Include a turkey baster, a mid-sized safety pin, a 12 ga cleaning rod with an extra section, patches, paper towels & a nice light gun oil (NOT WD-40!).

Next: prepare a bucket of very hot, soapy water. Drop the nipple into the water.

The Quick Way: Put your left thumb (or other finger) over the bolster. Use the turkey baster to squirt water down the barrel, swish it around, then empty Three baster loads per try is about right. Repeat three times, then use the pick to clean out the bolster, wiping it clean each time with a paper towel. Then repeat with the baster, then pick again. After a couple of repetitions, set the musket aside muzzle-down, find the nipple, get it out (ouch!) & pick out another layer of crud (wipe the pick off on the paper towel). Use the pin if necessary to clear the flash hole. Throw the nipple back in, and repeat the whole sequence until the water comes out clear, the metal is visible in the bolster, and you can't scrape any more crud from the nipple. Then use the rod & patch to swab the barrel dry. Apply a light film of oil to the nipple threads and all external metal. If you want, you can apply a light film of oil down the barrel, but use oil sparingly! Excess oil is one of the main causes of misfires.

TID-BITS from Lexington: Was Jerry really the spy? Does Jeff think it's fun to lie there on teh ground 15 minutes before being resurrected? Will the Captain do anything about certain people who missed roll call, drill & picket duty? Go to Roscoe & find out.

Lost & Found. Was it wagging its tail behind it?

The Right Way: Prepare as above, but add a screwdriver to your equipment. Remove the barrel from the stock. Stick the bolster end into the hot water, stick your cleaning rod down the barrel with a brush or a patch (wastebands from jockey shorts make excellent patches) on it & move it up and down setting up a siphon action. Repeat several times, then pick out the nipple & bolster as above. After several repetitions, get some clean, hot water & run it down the barrel to see if it comes out clean. Again, swab out the barrel with dry patches after letting it drain. Before reassembling the gun, put some Hoppe's gun grease on the ramrod retaining clip. then oil the barrel lightly (top & bottom).

The extras: Every few times, clean the crud from around the bolster - a knife blade lightly applied will suffice. Pull the lock plate and oil the springs to prevent rust (& broken springs). Use steel wool to clean rust off the ramrod & bayonet.

IN THE FIELD: The critical thing is to pick out the nipple & bolster, even if done dry. If you fire over 50 rounds, you may want to run some water down the barrel, depending on how quickly your gun fouls. Use HOT water, being careful to wipe off whatever you get on the stock. Drain the barrel, then swab it out if possible. I always carry some safety pins inside my trowsers for holes the nipple pick won't go through. Anothe rnice touch is to put surgical tubing over the cone (nipple) to keep water from running onto (and INTO) the stock & lock.
